Q3.) In general, what is the difference between Vote Forward's "Social" and "Political" campaigns?

Vote Forward's Social letter writing campaigns support their core social welfare mission, of helping increase participation of underrepresented communities in the electorate. These campaigns are frequently non partisan, with an emphasis on targeting underrepresented voters, such as people of color, women and young voters.

In contrast, their political letter writing campaigns support the political efforts the organization undertakes in addition to its core social mission. These campaigns are partisan, with a focus on encouraging Democratic-leaning voters to turn out in strategic states and districts.
